

# Is Your Meter Clear of Ice & Snow?

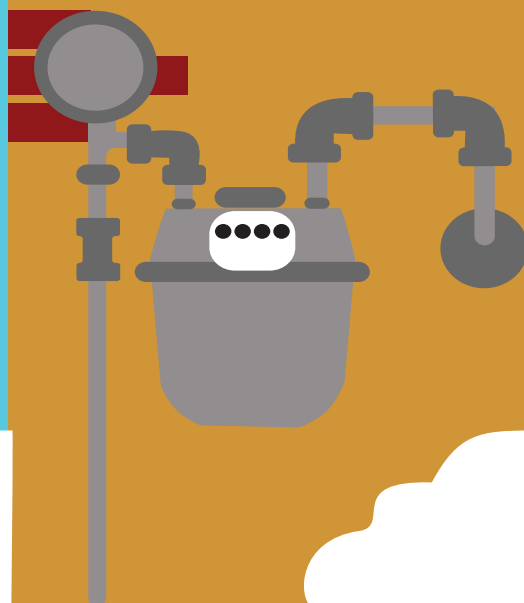
**Have you checked your gas meter recently?** Heavy snowfall this winter means your gas meter can quickly accumulate snow and ice on and around it. Follow this checklist of safety measures today to help keep the gas meter clear and your family safe.

**Is there snow and ice build-up on your meter?** If so, use a broom or soft brush to clear the meter, regulator, and surrounding piping to avoid accidentally damaging the meter. Never use sharp objects, like a shovel, snow shovel, or snowblower on the meter. In addition, never kick the meter to knock ice loose.

**Have ice and snow accumulated on your roof?** When removing snow and ice dams from your roof, be careful to not let them fall on your gas meter. This can cause leaks, break piping, and damage your meter. A great way to protect your meter would be to create a temporary shelter over it with a large piece of plywood.

**Is there a clear pathway to your meter?** Always maintain a clear path to the meter in case of an emergency. Large piles of snow can slow the response time when every second counts. Clearing snow from your driveway or rooftop is a good time to double check that first responders and ENSTAR employees can easily access your meter.

**Remember!** If you damage your meter or smell gas, call ENSTAR at 1-844-SMELL GAS (1-844-763-5542) and a service technician will be quickly dispatched to investigate the odor.
