Construction Updates

ENSTAR Construction Crews are hard at work this summer. Across our service area, ENSTAR has eight dedicated crews focused on a variety of essential tasks. This includes installing new service lines, relocating existing lines for projects such as building expansions, and performing necessary service line replacements. ENSTAR also has several additional crews who will be concentrating on system reinforcements throughout July.

Anchorage: Anchorage system reinforcements will include interconnecting the system along Elmore Road between O'Malley and Abbott. Our Anchorage welding crew will also be constructing a new pressure reducing station near the intersection of O'Malley and Elmore.

Mat-Su Valley: With the Mat-Su Valley being our fastest growing service area, installing new service lines keeps the crews busy, but there are still system reinforcements to include interconnecting the system along Knik Goose Bay Road near Knik Lake and continued support on the DOT's Glenn Hwy MP 34-42 Reconstruction Project.

Kenai Peninsula: Kenai Peninsula system reinforcements will include interconnecting the system along Big Eddy Road. The Kenai Peninsula welding crew will be fabricating a new gas delivery metering station sourced from a local well near Anchor Point, and the Steel Mains Replacement Project will continue in the Woodland neighborhood.

These essential tasks and ongoing projects are crucial for maintaining the integrity and reliability of our infrastructure and our ability to continue providing our Customers with safe and reliable gas service.

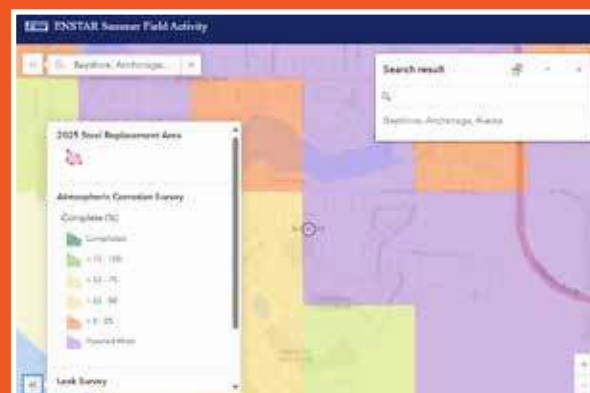
ENSTAR in Your Neighborhood

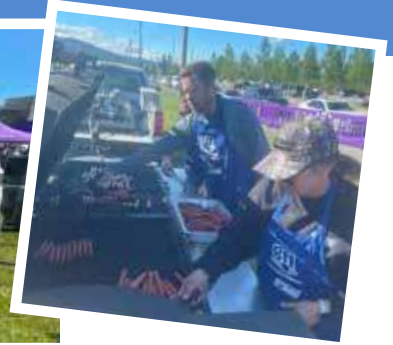
Once on the map page, type your address in the search bar. If your area is highlighted with a color, refer to the map's legend to see if the work is planned, in process or completed.

Dog & ENSTAR Employee Safety Tips

Safety is our number one priority at ENSTAR. Our employees often encounter dogs while accessing our meter facilities on your property, and we know that even friendly dogs can become aggressive when protecting the people they love. That's why it's important to review and follow these tips to help keep our employees and your pets safe:

-  Post a "Beware of Dog" sign on your fence or house so our employee knows there is a dog on the premises.
-  Be sure your dog is up to date on its vaccinations, wears a collar, and responds to basic commands like "stay" and "come."
-  If an ENSTAR employee is working outside your home, keep your dog in the house, even if you have invisible fencing.
-  If an ENSTAR employee needs to work inside your home, make sure your dog is in a separate, enclosed area before answering the door.



REMEMBER...

Whether you are installing a fence, planting a garden, or removing a tree stump, Alaska law requires you to call 811 for underground utility locates; every project, every time. Failing to call 811 is one of the main causes of pipeline damage and can add over \$1,000 to your project costs. More importantly, any damage to a pipeline puts the safety of you, your family, and your neighbors at risk.
